Red Fort - Installation done by IICD students at Red Fort

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The theme of the installation was 'The Tree of life. A symbol of regeneration and continuity, the national tree of India, the banyan tree was chosen to represent the theme. This installation brings together various crafts of India in one tree of life, which represents

harmony, solidarity and collective growth. After the completion of the project the installation was opened for the public at the Craft & Design Exchange Forum (CDEF). The installation will be at permanent display at the Red Fort barracks.

On the second day of the forum, the panel discussion, "Role of Academia in Craft Revival," chaired by Dr. Toolika Gupta, Director of IICD, Jaipur, brought together leading voices from premier design institutes across India. Esteemed panelists, including Dr. Mohammad Shahid (IIT Hyderabad), Dr. Sonika Soni Khar (Pearl Academy, Delhi), and others, explored academia's critical role in preserving and revitalizing traditional crafts through education, research, and innovation. The dialogue emphasized collaborations with artisans, the integration of crafts in curriculum, and fostering entrepreneurial skills among

students. This vibrant exchange of ideas underscored academia's pivotal influence in ensuring the sustainability of India's rich craft heritage.

ALUMNUS ACHIEVEMENT A talk by Dr. Santosh Kumar Jha

Our alumnus Dr. Santosh Kumar Jha, was invited for an Open Public Lecture (Solo), on 17th May 2024 to speak on the topic "Dynamics of Product Designing in Flexible Brass Craft of Belaguntha, Odisha" at the Indira Gandhi Centre for the Arts-IGNCA, New Delhi (Ministry of Culture, Government of India) upon an official invitation received from the Director, IGNCA headquarters at New Delhi.

His PhD research work was focused on a languishing craft, i.e. Flexible Brass Craft of Belaguntha, which was also the subject of his lecture at the IGNCA. In his thesis, he has attempted to work justifiably on the complete 'CRAFTS ECOSYSTEM CYCLE'. The flexible brass craft is a highly endangered craft, with 2–3 artisans left (even all of these are partially occupationally migrated now). His thesis was almost completely based on primary-data-sets, findings, and observations - received from the grassroots level.

Panel Discussion: How Can crafts shape Environmental, Social and Cultural Landscapes in Fashion

A thought-provoking panel discussion "How Crafts Shape Social, Environmental, and Cultural Landscapes in Fashion" was hosted by Fashion Revolution India and British Council, New Delhi. The event was attended by eminent panelists which included IICD director Dr. Toolika Gupta.

The discussion focused on how the fashion industry stands at crossroads, facing mounting pressure to address its environmental and social impact while trying to meet growing global demand. As consumers increasingly demand the fashion industry to adopt sustainability, there's a growing recognition of the pivotal role the craft sector can play in this transition. The panel reflected on how the craft sector can build scalable models in the fashion industry while upholding environmental, social and cultural stewardship.

MSU X IICD CULTURAL STUDIES WITH PURPOSE Documentary Filmmaking as Social Science Research

The Cultural Studies with Purpose Study Abroad Program is a collaborative initiative between the Indian Institute of Crafts and Design (IICD), Jaipur, and Michigan State University (MSU). Held annually during summer, this experiential program merges documentary filmmaking with social science research to explore complex social issues in Indian design and craft traditions. In 2024, the program spanned from May 1 to July 4, incorporating pre-departure virtual sessions, a cultural excursion, fieldwork, and a grand film screening event.

Guided by an interdisciplinary instructional team—Dr. Eddie Boucher (MSU), Ms. Dhruvswamini Bais (IICD), Mr. Pronoy Kapoor (IICD), Ms. Amina Darabie (MSU), and Mr. Stefan Lindahl (MSU)—11 students (6 from MSU and 5 from India) collaborated on four documentary projects. These explored diverse craft-related themes in Jaipur, emphasizing qualitative research and visual storytelling.

The program commenced with pre-departure Zoom sessions to develop research designs. Upon arriving in India, participants engaged in a three-day excursion, visiting cultural landmarks in Delhi and Agra, before settling in Jaipur. The instructional phase included sessions on ethical research, documentary filmmaking, and craft appreciation, followed by immersive fieldwork in Jaipur's craft hubs.

Students produced four impactful documentaries, which premiered on July 3 at the Rajasthan International Centre, Jaipur. The event included Q&A sessions, peer feedback, and certificate distribution, with Mr. Satish Depal, Deputy Director General

of Doordarshan Rajasthan, as the chief guest. The program concluded with reflection activities, including block printing, symbolizing the collaborative spirit.

This transformative program not only fostered cross-cultural understanding but also highlighted the power of design and filmmaking as tools for social exploration and craft preservation. Note: All the movies are now available on IICD website and youtube channel.

IIM U - CSIP

The Craft Sustainability Incubation Program, powered by Buimerc India Foundation and led by IIM Udaipur's Incubation Centre, aims to support early-stage social and creative enterprises in the arts and handicrafts sector with a focus on sustainability. The program works with businesses that engage artisans from Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh, helping them build a global 'Made in India' brand while promoting environmental responsibility.

This four-month program consists of three key modules, each including five days of residential training. While the first and third modules are held at IIM Udaipur, the second module is hosted by IICD Jaipur, one of the strategic partners for the program, which also contributed to designing the curriculum. IICD Jaipur's expertise in craft development played a pivotal role in enriching the learning experience for participants.

The program combines residential sessions with experts from various fields to help participants develop sustainable and profitable business models, expand their customer base, and lay the foundation for long-term success. Additionally, participants benefit from five coaching and mentoring virtual sessions to refine their growth strategies.

The program culminates in a 'pitch day,' where participants present their ventures to an expert panel of investors. Graduates continue to receive ongoing support from the Incubation Centre for twelve months after the program, ensuring sustained growth.

Through the strategic collaboration between IIM Udaipur and IICD Jaipur, the Craft Sustainability Incubation Program empowers artisans, fosters innovation, and drives sustainable craft enterprises' growth.

Summer Workshops

FACULTY ACHIEVEMENT Dr. Kingshuk Mukherjee

Dr. Kingshuk Mukherjee participated in HEPHAESTUS (Heritage in Europe: New Technologies in Craft for Preserving and Innovating Futures), an Itinerant Symposium on the Economy and Organization of Craft in Sweden, 2-4 May. Dr. Mukherjee presented a paper on May 3rd. The title of the presentation was 'A surviving folk tradition of Bengal: Kalighat Paintings (From early 19th century to present) - Transformation from traditional Pattachitra to contemporary Kalighat paintings'.
